Purpose of the Zoning Review

The Zoning Review will investigate how to consolidate the City's six parent by-laws into one by-law for the City. The Review will also look at ensuring the new consolidated by-law conforms with the City's Official Plan and its recent updates. Preparation of 8 discussion papers initiates the Review.

What is Zoning?

Zoning is an important planning tool used to guide the appropriate growth and development within a City. The Zoning By-law establishes permitted uses and performance standards such as building setbacks, and required parking rates.

Overview of Pickering's Zoning By-laws

The City is now regulated by 6 Parent Zoning Bylaws:

- 1. Zoning By-law 2511
- 2. Zoning By-law 2520
- 3. Zoning By-law 3037
- 4. Zoning By-law 3036
- 5. Zoning By-law 7364/14
- 6. Zoning By-law 7553/17



Discussion Paper 1 identified the following guiding principles for the Review:

- 1. Consolidate the existing Zoning By-laws into one By-law.
- 2. Ensure the new zoning by-law conforms to the City's Official Plan and local studies.
- 3. Ensure the new zoning by-law conforms with Provincial and Regional Plans and Policies.
- 4. Create a new by-law that is accessible, easily understandable and clear in its style and structure.
- 5. Address emerging issues not addressed in the existing zoning by-laws.
- 6. Through innovative approaches create a modern and contemporary zoning by-law
